WISCONSIN SPRING FEIS GRADE EXAMINATIONS – FRI MAY 10, 2024



Grade exams are one way to show your dance proficiency outside of a competitive environment. They aim to ensure that dancers at all levels learn the basics of each dance and that each dancer is given guidance on ways to improve his/her dancing. The exams are different from competitions, as the focus is more on the individual. Feedback is given to each dancer, highlighting their good points as well as the things they need to improve. Credits from the grade exams can be applied toward the solo dance portion of the TCRG and ADCRG examination. Dancers do not need to be regular feis competitors in order to participate in grade exams.

We are offering Grade 1-10. Different dances are specified for each grade.

- Each grade must be passed *before* a dancer may attempt the next grade
 - o QuickFeis registration will require you to document past passed exams
 - You must also **bring original certificates and other documents to the exam** as proof of passing past exams you will not be allowed to take advanced exams without these!
- Only up to **three** grade examinations may be taken at one time.
- A certificate is awarded for each grade passed.
- A dancer who passes all twelve grades receives "The Diploma of the Irish Dancing Commission."

ALL Registration and payment must be done at <u>www.quickfeis.com</u> CAP of 25 dancers only!

Registration is complete when payment is received. There will be no waiting list!

GENERAL EXAMINATION RULES:

- a) Only Basic Steps may be danced in the Preliminary grade and Grades 1, 2 & 3.
- b) The number of bars of music to be danced to for all Reels, Single or Hop Jigs Light Jigs, Slip Jigs, Heavy Jigs and Hornpipes is 40.
- c) St. Patrick's Day, Blackbird, Garden of Daisies, Job of Journeywork, King of the Fairies, Three Sea Captains, and Jockey to the Fair must be performed in a traditional style and manner.
- d) The same set dance must not be performed in more than one of the Grades from 9 to 12 inclusive.
- e) A dancer must take all grades in order, beginning with Grade 1 - the Preliminary grade is optional. However, a candidate may only attempt a maximum of 3 consecutive Grades at any one sitting.
- f) Candidates must be able to adequately demonstrate practical and theoretical knowledge of all ceili dances as per "Ár Rincí Céilí " as specified in the syllabus for Grades 5 -12 inclusive.
- g) Dance costumes should not be worn.
- h) All candidates must produce previous reports before proceeding to higher grades. Reports must be presented at examinations.
- i) Dancers taking the exams must be associated with a currently registered CLRG teacher.
- j) Full payment must be made at time of registration
- k) NO REFUNDS FOR ANY REASON!
